I. Determine if You Really Need to Ask for Forgiveness Matthew 5:23-24

3 Questions to Ask Yourself Before You Confess a Sin to Somebody Who is Not Aware of your Sin

- 1. Is restitution necessary and/or possible?
- 2. What are the chances that this will be discovered?
- 3. Will your confession help or hurt the other party?

Ephesians 4:29

II. Schedule an Appointment to Meet the Offended Party James 5:16, Matthew 5:24

III. Ask the Other Person for Forgiveness

4 Effective Ways to Do That

- 1. Refuse to blame others
- 2. Identity the wrong you have committed be specific
- 3. Acknowledge the hurt you have caused the other person
- 4. Ask the other person to forgive you

IV. Be Prepared for a Negative Response

5 Various Reasons Some People Use to Not Forgive

- 1. They sense you are not truly remorseful
- 2. They feel guilty themselves
- 3. The other person wants restitution
- 4. They fear repetition of the offense
- 5. They confuse forgiveness with reconciliation
